## **Shorter hours for ferries**

## Schedule changes due to drop in passengers after Jan 13

THE Penang ferry operating hours have been shortened due to the latest movement control order (MCO), said Datuk Tan Teik Cheng.

The Penang Port Commission (PPC) chairman said that after a thorough discussion, PPC and Penang Port Sdn Bhd decided to adjust the operating hours during the MCO period due to the drop in passengers

in passengers.

He said the last fast boat ferry ride from the mainland to the island would be at 8.30pm whereas the last fast boat ferry travelling from the island to the mainland would leave at 9pm.

"We monitored the passenger flow from Jan 13 to Jan 17.

"On Jan 13 to Jan 15, which were working days, we had an average of between 1,100 and 1,200 passengers a day.

"As for Jan 16 and Jan 17 which fell on the weekend, we had only around 600 passengers a day.

"From the five-day observation, we found there were only a handful of passengers from 8.30pm to 11.30pm.
"There were even some trips

"There were even some trips where we had only three to five people onboard and even some trips with no passengers at all," he said.

Tan added that the adjustment was necessary to save costs.

"To ensure that the working community is not affected during the MCO period, we will have two speed boats operating simultaneously during peak hours from 6.30am to 10am and from 4pm to 7pm.

"As for the old ferry carrying

"As for the old ferry carrying only two-wheeler vehicles, we have also shortened the operating hours.

"The last ride from Butterworth to the island will be at 7.30pm whereas the last ferry will leave the island for the mainland at 8pm.

"The service frequencies will remain the same during peak hours," he said.

Starting Jan 1, Penang's ferry service saw a new era with the use of two fast boats for foot passengers while one of the old

ferries is for two-wheelers only.

From 6.30am to 11pm, there is a trip every 20 to 30 minutes with

up to 27 round trips per day.

This is the interim phase until June 30 next year while the ferry terminals are being upgraded and hi-tech water buses and vehicular ferries are being built.
